Red Hill EEC Risk Assessment

Sites

Red Hill EEC conduct activities at various sites, both within the town and surrounds, old gold mining sites, farm sites, nature reserves and national park areas. All sites have been pre checked and are regularly checked for risk.

When off site the following applies:

- * Red Hill office staff know the whereabouts of all student groups and the type of activities they are undertaking at all times.
- * First Aid equipment is always carried by Red Hill Staff.
- * Staff are briefed on Bush Fire Safety measures.
- * Vehicle, telephone and GPS communication is available at sites.
- * All Red Hill Staff have current First Aid certificates or CPR and Emergency Care.
- * Visiting schools have a detailed itinerary and information on the various sites and activities.
- * The Centre, has in place emergency and evacuation procedures.
- * All staff are trained NSW Department of Education personnel and have experience and /or training in bushwalking and canoeing.

Activities

All activities carried out by Red Hill staff comply with the following Centre and NSW DET Policies:

- * Supervision Policy
